Kamakshi Saxena as a dance practitioner is drawn to the idea of creating experiences through movement. She has been a student of dance and continues to explore into the realms of movement practices. She started training in ballet, jazz and contemporary dance styles at The Danceworx performing arts academy, New Delhi and performed extensively with The Danceworx Company. She then moved to New York City to study at the Alvin Ailey School, for dance techniques like Horton, Graham, Ballet and Dunham. She also explored improvisational forms of movement at Movement Research in New York City. Back in India, she has presented her choreographic works at festivals like Contemporary Arts Week, Parallel Conversations, Prayatna Film and Dance festival and World Spanish day at Instituto Cervantes and has performed in works like Lost Wax by Preethi Athreya and Water Games by Michel Casanovas. She has taught at educational institutes like State University of Performing and Visual Arts, Jawahar Kala Kendra, Neerja Modi School and many more. She divides her time between teaching, performing, choreographing and curating performances, workshops and events at Maah Space.

Manju is a Dancer, Choreographer and Teacher. Her training is in Contemporary, Jazz, Classical Ballet, Hip Hop and Martial Arts. She is a certified yoga teacher. Her love to perform for larger audience took her to TV shows like Boogie Woogie (Sony) NDTV GoodTimes (Sweat) and Dance India Dance Season 3 (Zee TV). She has worked in The Danceworx Performing Arts Academy for 6 years as company dancer. She has toured internationally with productions 'Inhabited Geometry' and 'A Male Has a straight antennae' choreographed by Mandeep Raikhy. She has choreographed theatre production for National School Of Drama and Punjab Natshala (Amritsar) She continues to work with professionals in dance and theatre field while she is exploring her movement source through her own disciplined practice of contemporary dance.

Dadu was a poet of Nirguna tradition born in Gujarat in 1544 and lived and offered his teaching in naraina near Jaipur Rajasthan His poetry known as "Dadu vaani" is deeply connected with the folk languages of Rajasthan, His teachings have had great influence on a large part of Rajasthan.





An artist's heart is usually found somewhere situated inside his art. Abhishek Kumawat, who has been inclined towards the art of visuals since his engineering days expeditiously turned his passion into his profession. In his striking visual works, he often finds himself dwelling on the thoughts of its origin. As an artist my concerns revolves around the deep conflicts of human realities. Dancer Chaina Meena & Rakesh Dancer are cross dancers/boy dancers from Meena community in Dausa, Rajasthan. They are men who like to dress as women to perform. As children they would often dress as women to dance in wedding and other gatherings as fun and later decided to pursue this interest professionally. They perform in religious yatras, community gatherings, meenawati dangal, for local youtube music video channels & weddings. Through Jaipur Virasat Foundation they have also performed twice at Shift Festival by Awaaz Studio as part of the Folk Dance Circle.

Dancer Chaina Meena is the stage name of 32 year old Ghamandi Meena who hails from Raimalpura village in Lalsot, Dausa. Chaina is cross dancer बॉय डांसर / लेडीस बनके डांस करना) She/he has been dancing from the age of 10 years. She/he started dancing for 'shauq' and then started dancing in public on DJ for religious yatras, wedding functions etc. Then just before covid decided to pursue dancing professionally. Chaina thinks as she/he was brought up around majority of women and their ways influenced her/him.

Rakesh Dancer is the stage name of 24 year old Rakesh Meena from Amteda village, Dausa. She/he has been dancing as 'shauq' since childhood and then started performing professionally for youtube videos and kept it hidden from family and won't share their real name to hide their identity. Rakesh has been dancing professionally since 2017. Currently he is pursing polytechnic diploma course.

#### राधेय - Kathak

"राधेय" is a captivating fusion of dance and literature, inspired by the poetic masterpiece "Rashmirathi" written by the renowned Shri Ramdhari Singh 'Dinkar'. This performance, through the elegant medium of Kathak, brings to life the story of Karn, the unsung hero of the epic Mahabharata, in a mesmerizing and evocative manner.





Manaswini, a budding name in the world of Kathak, started her journey at an early age of 7 and found her holy grail after she was embraced by her Guru Pt. Girdhari Maharaj ji under Guru Shishya Parampara as his 'Gandhabandh Shishya'. A performer of Jaipur Gharana Kathak, currently she has completed her Master's degree in Performing Arts from Pune under the able guidance of Guru Pandita Shama Bhate ji.

Currently getting her advance training in Kathak under Guru Prerana Shrimali and Phd in Kathak under Dr. Vibha Dadhich, Manaswini is a member of International Dance Council UNESCO, Manaswini has completed her Nipun in the field of Kathak from Bhatkhande sangeet vidhyapeeth, Lucknow.

She has also won various accolades in the field of Kathak and was selected by the Minstry Of Human Resource Development for a cultural exchange programme that was held in Japan.

She has performed in productions of her Guru as well as a soloist in prestigious festivals like Navpallav 2022, Bhagyanagar Natyanjali Hyderabad, Nadneerjanam 2021, Raag Bairaag, Buzm -e- Jaipur 2019, Nityam Varshikotsav, Thirak Utsav, Yugm Diwas, Shilpkala Mahotsav, Rang-o- noor 2017, Uday Shankar Ballet 2018, Rajasthan Diwas'19 & so on.




## TANISH KHANDWAL

### Soundscapes - An evening of music





#### What's for dinner? - Installation exhibit




As we think of this image, a sense of nostalgia sweeps over, reminding us of stories of our grandmothers preparing luscious mouth watering meals for her family, or the memory of our mothers doing the exact same thing, probably yesterday. A memory of your wife making breakfast this morning. Or a memory of yourself? Doing the exact same thing.

What's for dinner? || आज खाने में क्या है?

is an immersive installation designed around real-life stories of the kitchen. Stories of women, stories by women, stories only spoken in passing, stories that give space to their dreams, desires, ambition, frustrations and heartbreaks.

This installation tries to open up the conversation around the unspoken rule of women being the caretakers of the kitchen.

# Maah 間

is a movement arts and performance space in Jaipur. It offers a place to Pause. It is an invitation extended to people to find space and time for the self again.

Through movement classes, workshops, community gatherings, performances and therapeutic healings, Maah intends to create a confluence of artists and art lovers from across the globe in the city.

Through the years now, Maah has played host to over 100 artists and has been an exchange ground for the artist and the viewer/listener.

Inspired by the Japanese word Ma (pronounced maah), Maah envisions to be the pure and essential void between all things. Like the negative space that gives form to the object in a picture, Maah is a working ground for creativity and exploration.



#### Shreeya Kishanpuria Agarwal

Shreeya is an art enthusiast, dancer and a mother. Shreeya manages the space with the purpose of creating an active community of artists that support and foster the growth of one another, in a nonjudgemental environment. She worked with Indian Women Blog, as a freelance blogger/writer. She studied and practiced contemporary dance in Bangalore during which time she had the privilege to meet fellow artists who have influenced her. She worked with Nritarutya, an Indian contemporary dance company based in Bangalore from 2009 to 2014. During this period, she had the chance to experience varied art forms under some of the best teachers - Indian contemporary under Vishwakiran Nambi, Nritarutya, modern dance under Nakula Somana, Yoga, Feldenkrais method under Michel Casanovas, capoeira with Einstein & Kathak under Guru Rashmi Uppal. She was part of a residency at Shoonya under the mentorship of Michel Casanovas where created a solo piece titled 'Home'. 'Home' was later chosen to be performed at Lshva festival 2015.

#### Kamakshi Saxena

Associate Director, Maah

Kamakshi Saxena is the Creative Head of Maah. She is a dance practitioner with 20 years of dance, performance and teaching experience. She started training in ballet, jazz and contemporary dance styles at The Danceworx performing arts academy, New Delhi and performed extensively with The Danceworx Company for about 10 years. She then moved to New York City to study at the Alvin Ailey School. She also explored improvisational forms of movement at Movement Research in New York City. Back in India, she has presented her choreographic works at festivals like Contemporary Arts Week, Parallel Conversations, Prayatna Film and Dance festival and World Spanish day at Instituto Cervantes. She was one of artists-in-residence at the Chrysalis Project 2015 by Friends of Art and at Gati Summer Dance Residency 2016 (awarded Inlaks Resident of the Edition) and has performed in productions like Lost Wax and Water Games.
